

Objectives:

1. Students will analyze their actions and how they are being perceived
2. Students will design a poster to show how they want to be noticed

Materials:

1. Poster material – one for each student (you can use next page or white paper)
2. Crayons/ Markers

Motivation: (3 min)

Pose the question: What do people notice when they look at you? Have students brainstorm answers.

Development: (10-15 min)

Follow up that question with having students think about what they WANT others to notice in them. Explain that we are going to be making posters of ourselves and what we want others to see in us. Ask for some volunteer ideas to help others think (I want others to notice.....my smile, kind heart, that I'm friendly, that I include people, I like to help, etc.). Have an example ready, or make one in front of the class (*If the teacher is comfortable model the process. Ask students what they notice about him/her. Then make a poster out of their answers)

Students create posters.

Closure:

Have students share their posters. If space, hang the posters in the classroom.
